# KEISER UNIVERSITY PROUDLY PARTICIPATES IN TOUGH MUDDER Proceeds to benefit the Wounded Warrior Project

Ft. Lauderdale, FL—Nov. 1, 2013—In a great show of overall school spirit and campus solidarity, over 100 Keiser University students, faculty, and staff, representing campuses across Florida, are participating in the annual Tough Mudder competition being held Nov. 3, at the Westgate River Ranch (3200 River Ranch Blvd.) in Polk County.

Keiser's involvement in this event is the vision of Executive Vice Chancellor and Chief Operating Officer, Peter Crocitto. Always with an eye for responsible community service among students and staff, and generating camaraderie and unity among Keiser University's campuses--which reach as far north and west as Tallahassee and as far south and east as Miami, Crocitto felt that the Tough Mudder competition benefiting the Wounded Warrior Project (WWP) was the perfect opportunity. Representing the University's first ever entry into the event, students and staff from nine of the Sports Medicine degree programs at Keiser's 17 campuses are competing.

"The teams have come up with creative and innovative ways to train and prepare for this grueling competition," said Crocitto. "There is a deep sense of friendly rivalry which has kept their motivation level high and developed an overall sense of school pride given that the end goal benefits America's heroes within the Wounded Warrior Project. Because of the extreme rigor of this event, the team members have bonded, vowing to finish as a team while also building their own self-efficacy in meeting their personal endurance goals," he added.

Proceeds from Tough Mudder benefit the WWP, which inspired many team members since nearly 20 percent of Keiser University's students are active duty service members, veterans, or military family members. This is the first year that Keiser University campuses across Florida are participating in the event and an in effort to support the health and wellness of the team members, and most importantly, the beneficiaries of the WWP, the University has sponsored the entry fees for all of its competitors.

Keiser University offers nearly 90 associate through doctoral degrees with a vast majority in the health care and sport management fields including nursing, dietetics and nutrition, exercise science, golf management, physician's assistant, and sports medicine and fitness technology, among many other career fields.
