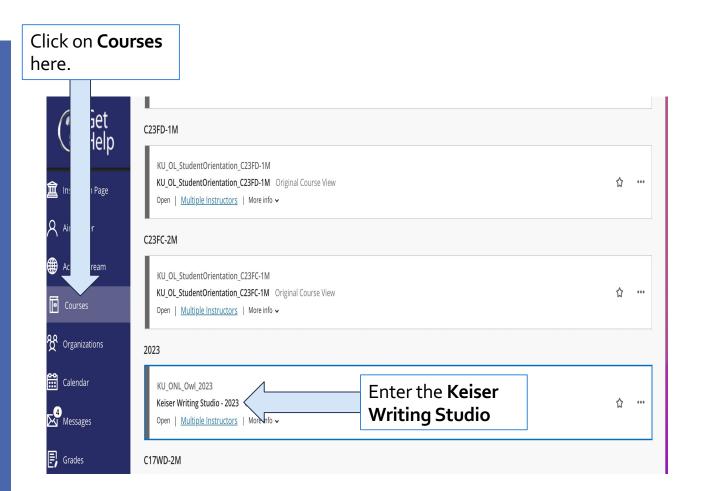

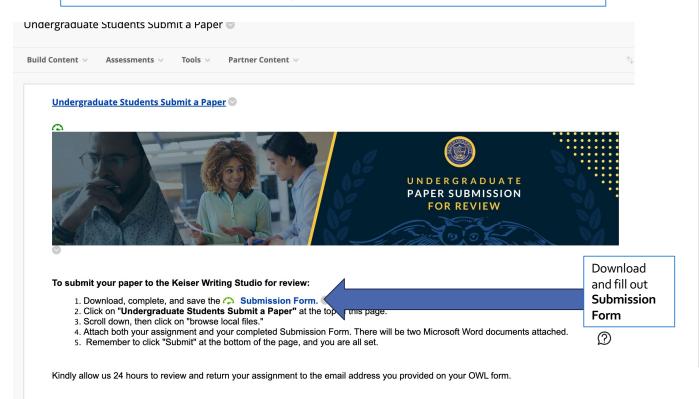

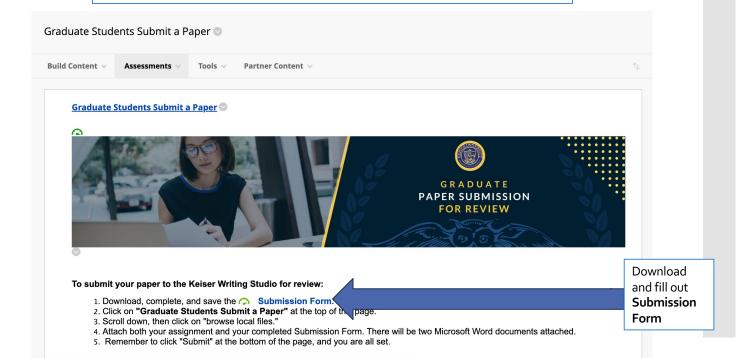

Graduate Students can submit work for review through the Graduate Students Submit a Paper tab.

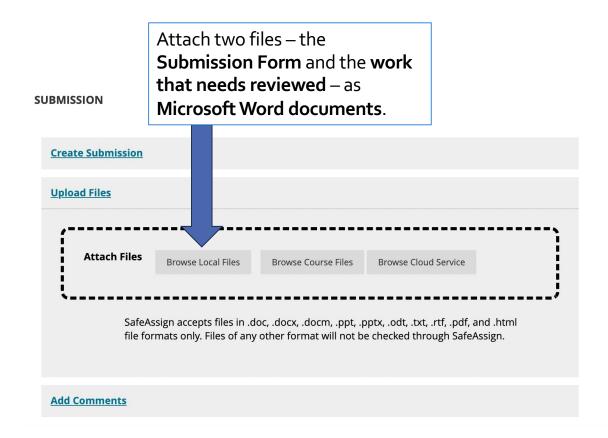
Make sure to download and include a **Submission Form**. The Writing Studio Coordinators need this information to return specific and useful feedback.

To submit a paper for review in the Undergraduate or Graduate sections, **upload both files** – the Submission Form and the work that needs review – as **Microsoft Word documents** (.doc or .docx).

The Writing Studio can review PowerPoints, too. Feedback for PowerPoints will only be left in the Submission Form.



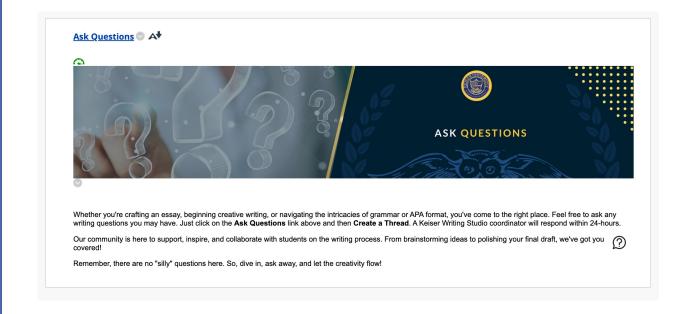
After attaching both files, click **Submit** at the bottom of the screen.

The Writing Studio will return feedback by email within 24-hours.



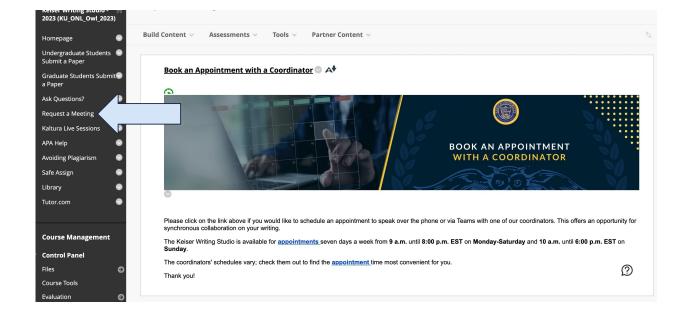
Direct any writing questions to **Ask Questions**within the Writing Studio classroom.

A writing coordinator will reply within 24-hours.



Students have the option to book a synchronous appointment with a Writing Studio Coordinator through phone or Microsoft Teams.

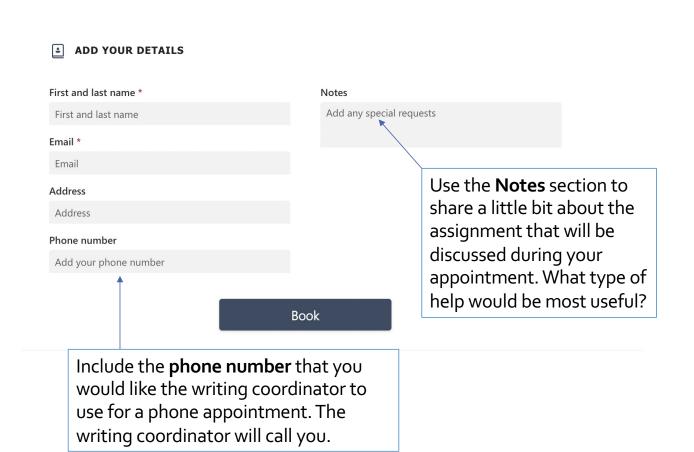

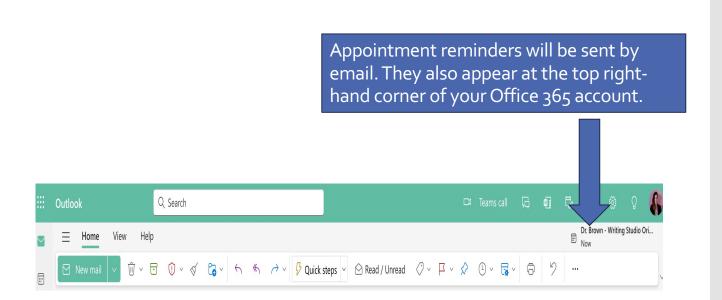
Click **Book** to request the appointment.



Teams Meetings will be saved in Office 365.

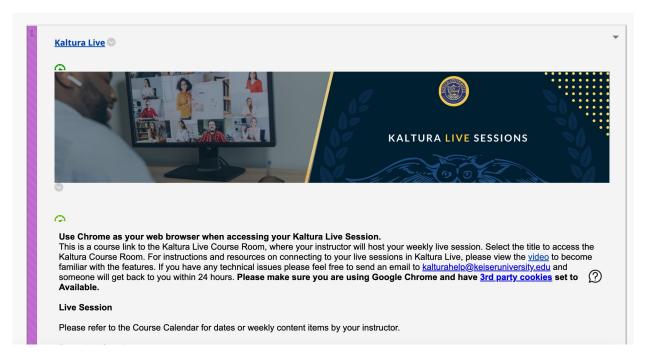
You will receive an email reminder about the meeting. It will also appear in the right-hand corner of Office 365.

The Writing Studio hosts bi-monthly webinars on different writing-related topics.

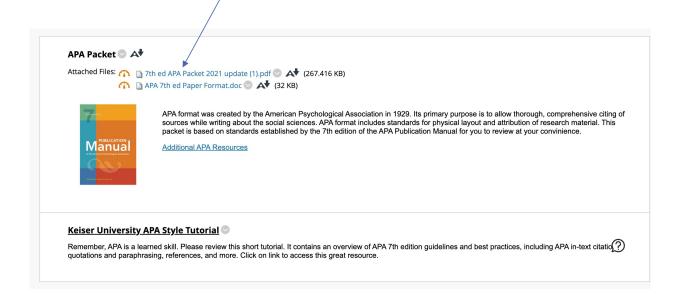

Keiser University Plagiarism Tutorial

According to the Merriam-Webster online dictionary, to "plagiarize" means:

- to steal and pass off (the ideas or words of another) as one's own
- · to use (another's production) without crediting the source
- · to commit literary theft
- to present as new and original an idea or product derived from an existing source

Plagiarism is thus an act of fraud that involves both stealing someone else's work and then lying about it afterward. Plagiarism can be deliberate or accidental, occurring through failure to properly document borrowed words or ideas from outside sources.

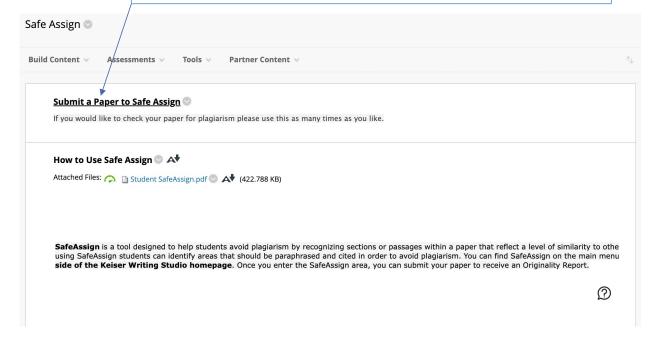

Students can submit through **SafeAssign** in the Writing Studio to check the similarity score on their assignments.

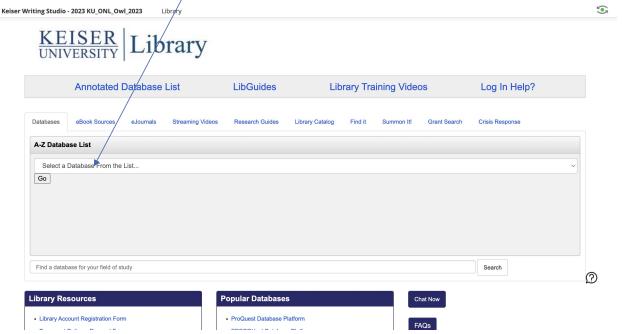
Papers can be submitted multiple times to see how revisions have affected the similarity score. Please reach out to the writing studio coordinators with any questions about similarity scores.
